# BCMC 230/14

# 2013/2014 - 4TH ADJUSTMENT BUDGET

Alderman Badenhorst, on behalf of the Executive Mayor, informed the Council that the purpose of this fourth Adjustment Budget was to spend funds which were conditional and linked to time, before the end of the financial year. He stated that if such funds were not used by 30 June 2014, they would revert back to National Treasury.

Continuing, Alderman Badenhorst advised that the Adjustment Budget would enable the movement of funds from a project in an area where there was no movement, to one in an area where the spending was going well.

He explained that such movement did not disadvantage the project from which the funds were being transferred, as those funds would be allocated to that project in the new financial year which would commence on 1 July 2014.

Alderman Badenhorst stated that this was a compliance matter and he requested the agreement of the Council thereto. He pointed out that all the processes had been followed by having it considered at all the relevant Committees of the Council.

#### **BUFFALO CITY METROPOLITAN COUNCIL: 25/06/2014**

(MINUTE NO. BCMC 230/14 CONTD.)

Councillor Sam, on behalf of the African National Congress, confirmed that the Urban Settlement Development Grant permitted the movement of funds from one project to another and that, by doing so, the Council was saving the Municipality from the embarrassment of not spending the grants.

He added that the Council was conscious that the projects which were ongoing would not stop. He commended the work of the Finance Portfolio Committee and officials from the Directorate of Finance. He said that the budget was merely being adjusted to enable the Council to do better this year than it had in previous years.

Councillor Matana said she concurred with the previous speakers, but expressed concern regarding the movement of funds from projects in one Ward to those in another Ward. She urged that the funds be used for projects in the same Ward.

The Chief Whip of the Council, Councillor Matwele, clarified what Councillor Matana was requesting.

The City Manager clarified that the projects were dealt with as a unit and the funds, e.g. for a sewerage project, could not be used for a roads project, or vice versa, as the Council had to manage and account for whatever was in the IDP. He suggested that officials and Portfolio Heads revert to attending cluster meetings and determining the needs in each area.

- That it be <u>NOTED</u> that the Council had considered the 2013/2014 4th Adjustment Budget Report of the Executive Mayor, to the Council meeting held on 25 June 2014.
- 2. That the adjustments in the sum of R6 113 296,00 to the 2013/2014 Operating Budget, be <u>APPROVED</u> by the Council.
- 3. That the adjustments in the sum of R2 251 355,00 to the 2013/2014 Capital Budget, be <u>APPROVED</u> by the Council.
- 4. That the 2013/2014 Adjustment Budget in the sum of R5 473 701 818,00 as reflected in the table hereof, be <u>APPROVED</u> by the Council:-
